# UPDATE FROM THE ASSOCIATE PASTOR



Dear Bethel Community,

Much has happened since the last annual report has been put together. In January 2013, we had a new interim lead pastor in place, a Call Committee had just been commissioned, and the "interim process" of critical evaluation of Bethel's strengths and weaknesses had barely begun.

Things began to speed up in Spring. The Call Committee hosted several Sunday morning "Fireside Chats" to listen to the congregation's hopes, dreams, and assessment of Bethel's present and past. A leadership retreat at Pajaro Dunes continued this process. First results of the Fireside Chats were presented and sobering financial and attendance figures were presented by the interim lead pastor. The chair of Bethel's Stewardship Committee, Brett Deutscher, successfully recruited new members into a Stewardship Taskforce, which designed an ambitious program of over 20 small groups, each of which had a host, a facilitator, and a scribe. The combined notes from these small groups amounted to over 50 densely printed pages! I wish to thank, once more, all who designed, attended, hosted, facilitated, recorded the small groups and all who then critically reviewed and evaluated the findings.

In August, we celebrated a lively Commitment Sunday. The sanctuary and the outdoor worship space felt abuzz with palpable excitement and willingness to step up to provide for Bethel's future ministry—time, talents, and financial resources (see the financial update on page 2 for faith commitment data).

In September, the taskforce charged with analyzing the small group data, proposed a ministry direction plan for Bethel and identified five ministry priorities: engaging communication, revived children and family ministry, the restructuring of Sunday mornings (to allow for adult Bible Study), service opportunities, and relationship building (i.e., evangelism). The work done at the Labor Day Retreat helped us to further brainstorm around these five ministry priorities.


In September, with input from a wide range of Sunday morning ministry leads, a basic Sunday morning structure was agreed upon.

The Worship & Music Committee then, after surveying the worship attendees over a span of 4 weeks, proposed a new Sunday morning schedule, which, together with the new Bible Study curriculum, was implemented on January 12, 2014. Over 70 people attended the first two Bible Study classes.


In the other four ministry priorities, important groundwork has been laid, as well:

**Family Ministry.** Support was provided to implement initiatives that had come from families (such as Second Sunday Picnic, Moms' Night Out); increased resources (such as magazine subscriptions, classes, new library resources) are made available to help

families raise Christ-centered children.

**Relationship Building.** The Caring Connections program (see page 8) has begun to bear fruit in form of newly strengthened relationships within the congregation.

**Service.** Behind the scenes (and in collaboration with Bethesda ministries) planning for a new ministry with and for people with special needs has begun. Watch for more information during Lent.

**Communication**. The Executive Committee, in conjunction with the HR Advisor, is currently reviewing the position of the Communications Specialist to improve communication within the congregation and advertising to the outside.

With great joy, I present to you this report which reflects the vibrant ministry that

is carried out at and through Bethel, and give thanks to God for His abundant Spirit which makes the ministry hat done in Christ's name. I look forward to reaping the fruits of this flurry of work in the coming year, studying together God's Word and watching that word to bear fruit in our lives, shared ministry, and Gospel-centered service to our neighbors.

The FY'14 income budget was built on the strong stewardship results and the facility use income negotiated by our business administrator, Fara Brock. The expense budget came together based upon the income available, cuts recommended by the Church Council task force, and continued tight expense control. Throughout the fall months, giving to the general fund was on track to meet the new budget of \$660,000 in giving to the general fund, and showed a modest increase over the previous year. After five years of declining giving, this is a welcome result.

# **Fire and Recovery**

An arson fire occurred on 9/5/12, severely damaging a preschool classroom and affecting areas of Torvend Hall. Clean up efforts, planning for rebuilding, selection of contractor and building plan submission are completed. Plan approval is anticipated in the next few weeks. Construction will include enlargement of classroom, replacement of tile and kitchen flooring, and relocation of storage, washer, and dryer. Half of the worn Torvend Hall roof will also be re-shingled. Completion is expected this Spring.



As a pilot project, a "Caring Connections" program was developed. Stephen Ministers attended a six-week workshop on "Listening for Depth of Understanding" lead by then Interim Pastor Carol Been. Subsequently, each Stephen Minister was given a list of 5-9 people among the Bethel community who they would contact on a regular basis. The project has been well received and we hope that it can be expanded in the future in order to foster greater concern for one another. The goal was and is to make



Bethel a more caring community. Towards that goal, the Caring Connections volunteers seek to make personal connections, give those called an opportunity to express likes and dislikes at Bethel, to inform them regarding special events, and generally to show we care.

# DISCIPLESHIP MINISTRY

Our Growing in Faith Ministry addresses the part of our mission statement that states "Grow and Equip one another as devoted followers of Jesus Christ". Several memberled groups achieve this by meeting monthly or weekly to deepen their knowledge of the Bible and Lutheranism by reading Lutheran magazines, study books and videos. They are: Women of Wednesday, Saturday Women's Bible Study, and Martha Bible Study. These groups have been studying God's word for years and welcome anyone would like to join. In addition to these on-site groups, there are several other groups that meet offsite.

Begun in the Fall 2011, Fun with Faith begins with a light supper followed by a one hour class on Wednesday evenings. The sessions begin the Fall and end at the start of Lent. Each session features a class each in "Bible Study", "Life Skills", and "The Arts". A session typically lasts 3 weeks.

The new addition to Discipleship this year is Adult Bible Study on Sunday mornings which began on Jan 12, 2014. Based on small group input over the summer, the Music & Worship committee carved out a 40 minute niche for that class between services. Unlike the short cycle Fun with Faith topics, the Adult Sunday Bible class focusses on a single topic in depth over a period of several weeks. With only 2 weeks into the program, attendance has been remarkable and the group table conversation is engaging. It will be a good year.

Bethel's home page was visited 9054 times in 2013, from 3827 unique browsers. In total, the web site served 173,873 pages. The top three pages accessed were:

- Sermon podcasts
- Calendar
- Home page

84% of the visits were from desktop browsers, 9% from mobile and 7% from tablets.

New features added to the website this year include:

- Ministry video (starting with Mission to Mexico and Labor Day Retreat), thanks to Chris Larsen

- Financial reports (moved from the bulletin), thanks to Fara Brock & Leslie Steen
- The new Constitution, thanks to Mary Thomas
- The weekly eNewsletter, thanks to Elise Holst

Our file transfer logs show 2284 website updates in 2013 to keep the content up to date, thanks to Patricia Myerholtz and many of our Ministry Leads.

We are working on a new design for our web pages that will be more friendly to the increasing number of mobile browsers.

In 2012, a major upgrade to internet access on the Bethel campus was begun. That year we changed service providers and added new network hardware. In 2013 the work continued with wireless access points added in Torvend Hall (including new outdoor wireless access capability for outdoor worship), and some additional access points added in the Sanctuary building to improve coverage. The campus-wide wireless network has now been completely installed. We are still working on some performance enhancements in Zoar Hall, where the largest concentrations of regular users reside. We should have our performance monitoring system in place by mid year, which will help solve these bottlenecks. The Torvend fire affected connectivity in Torvend and Preschool for a few weeks until the melted cabling was located and replaced. Your wireless internet device should be able to be used anywhere on our campus, including the front lawn.

# **Highlights from the Council Meetings in 2013**

The Church Council proposed changes to the constitution in regards to informing members by e-mail of the congregational meeting. The changes were approved at the congregational meeting in February 2013 and ratified in October 2013.

There was a leadership retreat for council members, ministry leads, and committees on April 27, 2013 at Pajaro Dunes. The retreat participants worked on establishing a draft of mission goals for Bethel to present to congregation.

The Church Council recruited an interim lead pastor who served Bethel until mid-July. After the interim lead pastor's resignation at the end of July, the council decided together with Pr. Gabi not to hire another interim pastor at this time in our call process, rather to use the wonderful talents of our members and other pastors to assist with preaching during the remainder of the interim period.

The Church Council addressed the budget shortfall by having a very intentional stewardship campaign and by approving a three-four month budget extension.

Many small group meetings were held over the Summer to provide members with an opportunity to discuss our ministry goals draft, provide feedback, and come up with some concrete goals for the near future as well as to provide stewardship information.

The Church Council confirmed the first five program areas arising from small group discussions, Sunday morning modifications, Communication, Service, Children/family ministry, Building relationships/evangelism.

A small subgroup from the Church Council revised the verbiage of our four ministry goals to enhance clarity and the Council approved the final draft of our four mission goals.

The Church Council hired a consultant from Alban Institute to assist in developing an appropriate staffing pattern and budget for Bethel's mission. A small subgroup from the council worked together with the consultant. The budget taskforce came up with several recommendations, that were approved by the council.

The Church Council had several meetings with the call committee and Bishop's Associate Nancy Nelson in regards to the call process for a new pastor.

The Church Council approved the Ministry Site Profile (MSP), developed by the Call Committee. Instead of using the Healthy Start Program the council decided to create our own intentional process to introduce the new pastor to the congregation.

The Church Council decided to follow the recommendation from the Mission Outreach Committee to again host the Silicon Valley Rotating Shelter at the Stelling Site during May, since there was an excellent response to assist with this endeavor from the congregation.

The Church Council decided to post a financial overview on the website to make Bethel's finances more understandable.

The Church Council asked the website committee to add online giving to the website to make it easier for people to make donations.

Stelling: the 7-year agreement regarding relationship with former Redeemer Church site ended. Bethel's stewardship of the site was positively acknowledged by the Synod.

The council reviewed the 5-year energy consumption report. Our solar production remains the same over the past 5 years. Interestingly, our energy consumption has increased since 2009; conservation is important for all of us to consider when we use the facilities at Bethel.

The council will support and encourage all adults to participate in "The Story." (Adult Bible Study program, beginning 1/12/14)
