

sound and video. Volunteers are needed to run the sound and video systems when needed, as well as possibly helping with video projects as they come along. Learn how to run Media Shout (the software used for projecting worship content on the screens in the Sanctuary). After an initial training period and a period of "shadowing" experienced operators, volunteers can sign up for either worship service.

Confirmation is designed to be inviting and have a friendly, fun, challenging and exciting atmosphere. This evening program shatters the "church is boring" stereotype and helps teenagers celebrate God's presence in their lives. It is filled with laughter, antics, videos, singing, dramas, a message and small groups that will challenge middle school students toward spiritual maturity. Confirmation classes typically meet on Sunday mornings, September to May, 9:45-10:45am. Occasionally, longer classes are scheduled.

In the process, families learn the building process, which helps make their community more self-sufficient, and Bethel volunteers practice their Spanish, and touch the lives of our neighbors south of the border. These three days of work, laughter, growth and fun lead to changed lives on both sides of the border.
