#### TREASURER HIGHLIGHTS

The fiscal year for 2015 (FY'15) ended in August without a deficit as projected. The final Net Income for FY'15 was \$6,700. Giving for FY'16 was projected to continue at the same level as 2015 with a total amount of \$625,000 for the year. After the first four months of FY'16, giving is more than \$6,100 above projections. This is an especially welcome result considering the large fundraising campaign to purchase a new bus.

The budget for FY'16 was passed at the August congregational meeting with a deficit of \$29,000. That amount is significantly smaller than it could have been due to a few cost saving initiatives by Pr. Ben and our business administrator Fara Brock. We will save nearly \$29,000 this year because of the refinanced mortgage and re-negotiated copier lease. If giving continues at a similar rate we should end the year with a much smaller deficit than anticipated.

#### STEWARDSHIP HIGHLIGHTS

A small percentage increase for the campaign in 2015 versus 2014. Promised \$430K, which represents about 2/3 of our total offerings annually.

It is notable that our bus campaign received over \$100K and that shows our members can and will donate more if they feel so moved.

A significant number of members do not make faith promises for whatever reason but we do enjoy about 1/3 of our offerings from this this group.

The 2016 Annual Stewardship campaign is around the corner and we look forward to sharing Bethel's mission with everyone and asking our members to give freely of their time, talent, and treasure.

# MISSION OUTREACH: QUILTS

Another aspect of Bethel's outreach ministry are the many quilts that our congregation is able to distribute to people in need — locally, nationally, and internationally. This year, for example, the receiving groups include: LWR, Esperanza International, Bethel Lutheran School, Bethel Lutheran Church (Labor Day Retreat), First Emmanuel COME, Gloria Dei Lutheran Church, Habitat for Humanity, Heritage House, Palo Alto VA (for homeless vets), San Jose Family Shelter, Santa Clara Valley Medical Center ICN, South

Hayward Parish, Faith in Actin Silicon Valley Rotating Shelter (Stelling Site), Stonecroft Ministry, Sunny View Retirement Community. In addition, the quilters also contributed 111 backpacks to be used through the LWR.

Our quilters were able to produce a truly astounding number of quilts: a total number of 309 quilts (254 large and 55 small. Over the years, the group has made a impressive total of 3,723 quilts.

**Visitor Follow-Up: V**isitors worshipping at Bethel are being responded to by email or card within 48 hours. A record of when they visit is kept as well. These records have helped in developing the list for our new member classes.

**PrayerBytes:** This is a ministry, dreamed up and organized by Robyn Winegardner, in which individuals can opt into getting a daily email with a list of "byte" size prayer requests taken from the Sunday insert. This ministry hopes that Bethel's prayer list in this format makes it easier to handle and less overwhelming on a daily basis. This has helped members focus on and personalize their prayer time. To add someone to the Prayer List and PrayerBytes, contact Pr. Gabi.

Stephen Ministry/Caring Connections: Stephen Ministry/Caring Connections continues to meet the 2nd Monday of the month at 7pm in the Fireside Room. Pastor Ben is leading the group into the "Caring in the 21st" process. In this process names are given to the team so they can continue to connect with those members who maybe going through transitions in their lives and remind them that they are not alone. For example, new empty nesters, divorce, living alone, major health issues, newly married, recent losses, ets. This new process is being well received and running very well.

**Prayer concerns are also shared.** Relationships between Stephen Ministry caregivers and care receivers are pray fully considered and resources shared with confidentiality.

#### Goals for 2016

- Continue and expand the Caring Connection Ministry, ultimately to the whole congregation.
- Keep encouraging all worship participants to fill out the Caring Connection cards in the pews each Sunday.
- Encourage more members to participate in the PrayerBytes Network.
- Work towards the goal that all members would feel that the congregation cares about them personally.





We discussed women's health issues, such as; menopause, pre-menopause, and diabetes prevention, food allergies, weight gain, and other health concerns. We served coffee, tea, and a healthy salad for lunch.

Monthly Fleece Blanket Making – We have made over a hundred blankets this year. We meet monthly to make blankets for the homeless and needy, and we made approximately 5-8 blankets per month. The blankets were donated to: The San Francisco Night Ministry, Manna House in Oakhurst, Ca. San Jose Family Shelter, and a children's shelter in Santa Cruz.

I attended the 12<sup>th</sup> Biannual Sierra Pacific Synod WELCA convention in Oakhurst at the Eco Retreat Center as a representative for the Executive Board member for Church-Wide WELCA. We elected new board members for the Sierra Pacific Synod. I also attended a convention in Fort Dodge, Iowa, and Milwaukee, Wisconsin as a speaker, which I did a workshop on Awareness and Ways to Help Stop Human Trafficking. I served on the Committee for grants and scholarship where we donate funds to non-profit organizations that serve women and girl's needs.

## BETHEL BUS CAMPAIGN

The Bethel Bus is Bethel's mobile ministry to the world.

In 2015, we said goodbye to our Krystal Coach bus. While it served us well and provided impromptu opportunities to meet new people along the road (like those who gave rides when we broke down), it was time to retire it from our demanding use.

With each challenge comes great opportunity. In the period of a little over 2 months, Bethel members and friends raised over \$100,000 towards the purchase of a new Grech coach. It has already been on the road numerous times and we look forward to lots of fellowship, service and opportunities to engage friends.

Like our facilities, it is more than just a bus. It is a ministry tool used to share the love of Jesus. This one just gets us a little farther outside our walls. Get on board, the bus is coming!



The wireless internet rollout continued this year on the Bethel campus. We finished upgrading all of the access points to a more reliable version. We also changed internet providers, greatly increasing the speed of the internet on campus.

In the office, we purchased and installed 1 new PC and one new Apple laptop. Plans for 2016 include updating all of our Windows 7 computers to Windows 10 while the upgrade is still free.
