This year's theme is "Everybody has a story..." where we'll explore our own faith stories and those of our community. To help get your story-juices flowing, each week we'll look at one of the themes from Anne Lamott's book, <u>Bird by Bird: Some Instructions on Writing and Life</u> and ponder how that can be applied to our own faith stories.

Here's your Faith Story Big Idea of the Week:

Anne Lamott declares that to find your own voice, you have to be honest with your reader. In the context of our faith stories, this might seem hard or scary. What about the parts of our stories that we're ashamed or embarrassed about? Well, if we try to sanitize our stories they'll end up sounding like the bland musings of ChatGPT. People don't want to hear stories with no voice. They want to hear stories with feeling - with excitement, thrill, joy, and triumph, but also with hurt, sadness, failure, and loss. Because at the end of the day, people want to hear stories that let them know they're not alone.
